Late arrivals and early collections

If your child is late to school, you must accompany your child to the school office to obtain a 'Late Arrival' note from the school office prior to proceeding to the classroom.

You must also obtain an 'Early Departure' note from the school office prior to collecting your child from the classroom if they leave the school prior to 3:15pm.

Attendance:

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

It is the duty of the parent of a child of compulsory school-age to enrol the child at a government school, a registered non-government school, or be registered for home schooling. Children who are enrolled at school attend every day the school is open. If a child is absent an explanation is to be provided to the school in two working days via Sentral Parent Portal, telephone or email.

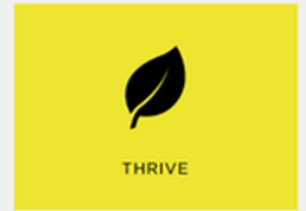
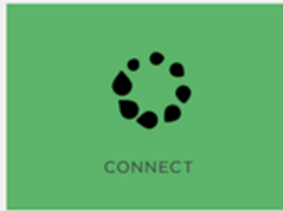

Student wellbeing

At Bellevue Hill Public School we are committed to providing learning opportunities that promote positive wellbeing of children and young people. We offer several programs which support student wellbeing including Grow Your Mind,

Grow Your Mind

The 'Grow Your Mind' Program focuses on the four pillars to promote mental health & wellbeing:

1. **Positive Psychology** - the study of character strengths and flourishing
2. **Social and Emotional Learning** - the study of how individuals acquire the knowledge, attitudes, and behaviours needed to develop the skills for self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making
3. **Public Health** - the study of the prevention of illness and promotion of health
4. **Neuroscience** - the study of the function and structure of the brain and nervous system.

Student Leadership and Voice:

At Bellevue Hill Public School, our students have multiple opportunities to develop their leadership skills.

Leadership Opportunities

Leadership is encouraged for all students; from classroom helpers and leading peers in learning to leadership teams. Our student leaders greet you at the gate each day, conduct assemblies, and represent the school on formal occasions such as Anzac Day ceremonies.

All students complete leadership and peer mediation training in Year 5. As part of these two courses students undertake a range of activities designed to enhance their leadership and mediation skills.

Student Representative Council (SRC)

The SRC is made up of a representative from each class across the school. This ensures that the voice of all students is heard as students work together to discuss and vote on student initiatives across the school.

Green Team

The Green Team is an environmentally forward student group whom pride themselves on looking after the physical wellbeing of the school. Their initiatives include the vegetable garden, composting, the native bee hive and waste reduction.



Homework guidelines

Homework is a valuable part of schooling. It allows for the practising, extending and consolidating of work done in class. Homework provides training for students in planning and organising time and develops a range of skills in identifying and using information resources. Additionally, it establishes habits of study, concentration and self-discipline.

(Department of Education, Homework Policy)

At Bellevue Hill Public School all students are given homework that is appropriate for each student's age and ability.

There are three main types of homework:

- **Practice exercises** – students apply knowledge or review, revise and reinforce newly acquired skills. Examples include memorizing mathematical tables, practicing spelling words, essay writing, or reading for pleasure.
- **Preparatory homework** – students gather background information in preparation for a unit of study. Examples include collecting pictures of hot or cold things and collecting geometric shapes
- **Extension assignments** – students are encouraged to pursue knowledge individually and imaginatively. Examples include writing a book review and retrieving information from newspapers and the internet.

Kindergarten – Year 2

In Kindergarten students have home reading and sight words as homework. All activities at home or in play can assist children to develop a wide range of knowledge and skills including literacy, numeracy and problem solving.

Year 1 and Year 2

Formal homework will be set to support students to develop positive learning and study habits. This will include reading, spelling and maths. The time spent on homework each night should be approximately 30 minutes.

Years 3 – 4

Students will be expected to work with greater independence on homework tasks. Homework tasks include: reading, spelling, maths, times tables, and some projects to assist with the development of study skills. The time spent on homework each night should be approximately 45 minutes.

Year 5/6

A homework outline is issued each week which includes tasks such as: reading, spelling, writing, research and mathematics. Incomplete work and project-based learning may also be included. The time spent on homework each night should be approximately 1 hour.



Assessment and reporting

At Bellevue Hill Public School, teachers use a variety of assessment strategies to assess students for, as and of learning throughout the year to inform teaching and learning activities. This includes: observing students' work, collecting work samples, using rubrics, and conducting summative tests. These are all used to analysing and record information about students' progress. Consistent teacher judgement is achieved by comparing work samples across the grade, stage and against the syllabus standards.

In line with the Department of Education Policy, reporting is a planned process.

Term 1: Parent/teacher interviews are conducted at the end of term

Term 2: Semester 1: a formal written report is completed and sent to parents in Week 10

Term 4: Semester 2: a formal written report is completed and sent to parents in Week 10

All formal reports aim to provide a plain English summation of the student's academic, creative, physical, personal and social growth over a semester. Years 1-6 use the A-E common grade scale to meet the Department of Education's assessment and reporting guidelines. In addition, we report on your child's effort and encourage students to take ownership of their learning by setting personal goals and reflecting on them throughout the year.

Kindergarten enrolment

Bellevue Hill Public School looks forward to warmly welcoming Kindergarten students starting school.

We have a range of school tours and parent information sessions on offer as well as Kindergarten orientation sessions planned for your smooth transition into our wonderful school community.

Your child can start Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five on or before 31 July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday. It is important that you let us know if your child has any special circumstances, allergies, health or medical conditions before your child starts school.

When to start your child at school is an individual decision. You may want to discuss this with us or with your child's preschool teacher, carer or doctor. Please see our enrolment page on the school website for detailed information about enrolling your child at Bellevue Hill Public School. To find out whether you live within the Bellevue Hill Public School catchment area please search for your address using the School Finder website.

School tours are currently being held. Please see our school tours page on the website for more information. Kindergarten is an important year of schooling as children formally begin to develop their literacy and numeracy skills. Our whole school community will help your child adjust to school and help them to feel comfortable.

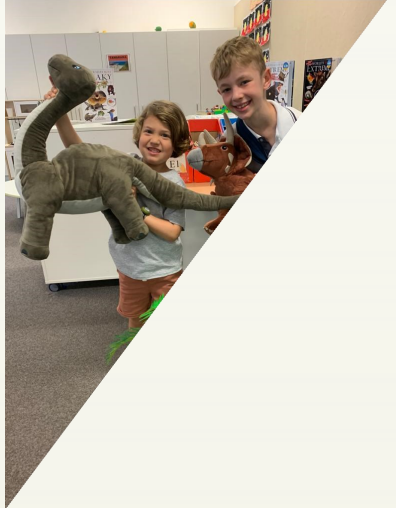
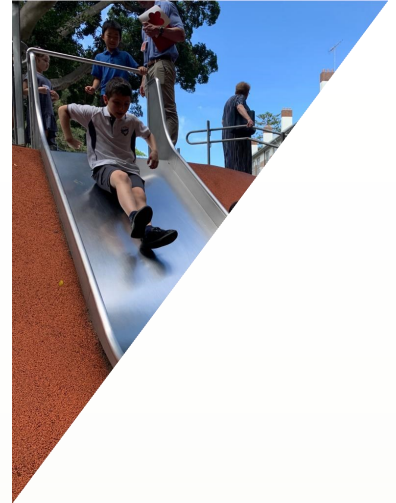
Kindergarten—Year 2

Students K-6 participate in a physical education lesson with our dedicated teacher Mr. Darran Rawson. These skills are essential for students to participate successfully in lifelong physical activity and sport.

Friday Sport Years 3—6

Students in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to participate in sport on Fridays. Some students will represent the school as they participate in PSSA sport, competing against other schools in the Sydney Coastal region. Students who do not participate in these sports will have the choice to participate in a select number of other sports or in School Sport. The School Sport program follows the PSSA sports, teaching the skills required for the given sport. For example: cricket and basketball in summer and netball and football in winter.
