Why a nut free school?

 Many children suffer from allergies to a variety of stimulants and experience symptoms as minor as a runny nose to serious life threatening reactions

What is anaphylaxis?

- Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening.
- Of these, nut allergy is the most severe.
- It could take between 5 and 15 minutes for a child having an anaphylactic reaction to die through their throat swelling and closing of the air passages.

How do we prevent such a reaction?

- Due to the severity of the reaction, the best way to prevent a reaction is to manage the child's environment as much as possible.
- Appropriate management reduces the chance of a fatal allergic reaction.
- For example, by eliminating a product such as peanut butter, we are reducing the risk associated with it sticking to playground and computer equipment, door handles, etc and therefore being touched by the allergic child.
- MICROSCOPIC AMOUNTS OF PEANUTS CAN CAUSE A FATAL REACTION

What is the school putting in place?

- Bellevue Hill Public School, along with a growing number of schools through out Sydney, have made the decision to become a NUT FREE SCHOOL.
- Products not to be brought into the school grounds are:
 - o Peanut Butter
 - o Any kind of nut butter, including Cashew Butter, Almond Butter, etc
 - Nuttela spread
 - o Muesli bars containing nuts
 - o ANY nut snack such as chocolate coated nuts
 - o NUTS of any kind

Surely my child in a different class does not have to follow this?

- Each and every child attending the school will need to follow this policy
- A child eats 21 meals a week. We are asking that 5 of these meals are nut free to minimise the danger to another child's life
