Centre for Excellence: G.A.T.E.WAYS

This week Bellevue Hill Public School hosted the G.A.T.E.WAYS Eureka program. On Wednesday students in Years 1, 2 & 3 participated in a number of rotated activities including: a study of Ancient Rome, finding treasure, and cracking codes with 60 students from other schools. On Thursday students in Years 4, 5 & 6 participated in a number of rotated activities including: collaborative maize tasks, solving algorithms, preventing a cyber attack, syllogism and a Nordic task with 60 students from other schools. All students used logical reasoning, critical and creative thinking and applied their general knowledge. I have now learnt what syllogism is!!

BHPS Safe Grounds Policy

Before School

The Bellevue Hill Public School day starts at 9.15am. At **8.45am** the gates open and teachers come on duty. The back playground of the school is hired by the before and after school 'Kids Club', which is a private company. Our students must not use their space before 8.45am. Any student who arrives before staff are on duty are asked to sit down under the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) near the school hall until the staff (wearing high visibility orange vests) come on duty.

MONDAY: Whole School Assembly in back playground at 9.15am. FRIDAY in Terms 1 & 4 only: PSSA Sport students assemble in the front playground for SPORT Buses from 8.45am.

All other students arrive after 8.45am and move to the back playground. Kindergarten may remain in the COLA.

After School

Our school finishes at 3.15pm. All students (including Kindergarten from Term 2) must move to and sit down at either the COLA or Go With The Flow (GWTF) areas for pick up. Supervision of these areas finishes at 3.30pm, as teachers must report to afternoon meetings. The school gates are closed at 3.45pm and we ask that all students and parents exit before this time to allow the companies using our facilities to start their activities.

The back playground is not an area where parents or students may wait or play after the 3.15pm bell- as from 3.15 this becomes the hired property of the 'Kids Club'. Parents can enrol their students in this club if they wish to participate in the activities there or furthermore we encourage parents to use the Bellevue Hill Park area to socialise after school hours.

GWTF

Go With The Flow after school is situated on the left-hand side of the main entrance ramp. Students sit on the ledge as they arrive with their bags. Parent volunteers and assisting teachers check cars and escort students to the cars on pick up. Please keep this area clear for ease of flow. All other parents and students should use the front and side pedestrian gates to exit.

Wet Weather

Before School: All students arrive from 8.45am and wait under the COLA. A bell will sound and a phone announcement will be made at 9am to indicate all teachers & students to go straight to classrooms.

After School: 'Go With The Flow- Wet Weather' is held inside the foyer of the **Kids Club** area. Students are to sit or stand quietly and listen for the GWTF numbers being called. We ask that no other parents or students should try to exit from this foyer on rainy days to help ease the congestion.

Strangers in Cars:

Watch out for Cars that follow you.

Never hop in a car with a stranger.

Never approach strangers sitting in a car.

Playing Outside:

Never approach or talk to a stranger that comes into the park/ your yard.

If someone makes you feel unsafe, go straight away to tell a trusted adult.

Always play in an area where an adult can see you.

Year 6 - Russian Class Gifted and Talented in Languages



The New South Wales Rural Fire Service is a volunteer-based firefighting agency and statutory body of the Government of New South Wales. The NSW RFS is responsible for fire protection in 95% of the land area of New South Wales and the Jervis Bay Territory, while urban areas are the responsibility of Fire and Rescue NSW.

he NSW RFS is the primary agency for responding to bushfires in the state. In addition, they respond to structural fires, vehicle fires, motor vehicle accidents and wide range of other emergencies, as well as providing preventative advice to local communities.


Are you sick of lost or overdue library books? Damaged library books? Can't borrow a book when you need to? Going on holidays and don't want to take library books with you?








Koori Art Expressions

On Wednesday night, students who participated in the Koori Art Expressions group and their families were invited to attend the opening of the exhibition at the Australian National Maritime Museum.

Inspired by the 2019 NAIDOC Week theme, 'Voice, Treaty, Truth', over 75 works are featured in this exhibition. While developing the artworks, students reflect on the unique connection Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have to country and how the achievements of the past inform and further our aspirations and plans for the future. Paintings, photography, textiles, sculptures and videos are among the diverse works on display. The exhibition is open daily from 9:30-5pm until the 28th January and has free entry.





Inspired by an artwork by Adam Reid, students drew lines in Earthy tones, representing the many individuals within the Indigenous population. The three large cracks show the themes of *Voice, Treaty and Truth* spreading like the roots of a tree, as these ideas are becoming grounded within the Australian culture.

Students met weekly to create the collaborative piece, *Taking Root*, for the exhibition, as well as their own individual art works to keep.
