#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **School Community Charter**

In December last year, the NSW dept of Education launched a charter which is devised to ensure schools are respectful learning environments.

The School Community Charter outlines the responsibilities of parents, carers, educators and school staff in NSW public schools to ensure our learning environments are collaborative, supportive and cohesive.

Furthermore, the charter outlines what parents can expect in engaging with their school as a partner in their students learning; highlights some unacceptable behaviours that have no place in our school communities; and provides a framework for establishing positive behaviours and terms of engagement.



We work in partnership to promote student learning.



We treat each other with respect and fairness.



We communicate in a positive and constructive manner.

#### **Language Teachers Expertise**

The expertise of two of our language teachers has ben recognissed by the DoE. Moira Liora and Dr Petrova have been invited to be part of and education group, writing new syllabus doocuments for Russian and Hebrew. Dr petrova was also invited to speak about the teaching of Russia at the *United Through Language Conference* at the end of 2018. Congratulations Irina and Liora.

#### **General Satisfaction Survey**

Each year, we put out a survey to parents and staff to gauge satisfaction about the programs and general running of our school. This is usually posted at the end of the year, however, this did not happen last year, so I am forwarding it to you now.

The survey usually asks three simple questions about the strengths of Bellevue Hill Public School, what programs are particularly successful and valued and what suggestions for improvement can be made.

This year, I have also added some questions about food service at Bellevue Hill, in particular, your thoughts about food days or the possibility of more provision of food in different ways. A link will be forwarded to you by email.

#### **Cyclist Safety**

Safety of students is paramount at the end of the school day when so many parents are trying to pick up their children from the front of our school. Our *Go With The Flow* initiative assist us with this safety.

However, parents need to be aware of traffic, particulally buses, other cars and **cyclists** when pulling out from the GWTF and turning in the turning circle. We have had a request from one cyclist who has almost been hit on several occasions by cars blindly turning in front of him.

We have a large volume of lost property being left around the school. We encourage you to discuss with your child/children, the importance of responsibility of personal belongings during the day, especially during recess and lunch.



All ice blocks are \$1


**Green Team**

Please follow these rules:

**ONLY THE FIRST 15 CARS** in the queue are allowed to park, no double parking down Birriga Road as you will be booked! Please use the turning circle at the school, turn right onto Birriga and use the roundabout to then re-join the queue.

**NO DOUBLE PARKING** on either side of the slip road – offenders will be photographed. Police and rangers are patrolling the area both morning and afternoon.

in the GWTF line as this causes unnecessary delays. Please be courteous, considerate and use common sense when dropping off or picking up kids in GWTF.
