Commonwealth Day

Commonwealth Day is celebrated every year by 53 Commonwealth countries on the second Monday in March. This year it falls on **Monday 11 March 2019**. The aim of commemorating Commonwealth Day is to promote understanding of global issues, international co-operation and the work of the Commonwealth of Nations to improve the lives of its citizens. 2019 also marks the 70th anniversary of the formation of the Commonwealth as it is configured today, with old ties and new links enabling co-operation towards social, political and economic development, which is both inclusive and sustainable.

Inner Sydney High School

The new Inner Sydney High School is scheduled to open Day 1, Term 1 2020 for Year 7 students. The Principal, Ms Robyn Matthews (previously the Principal of South Sydney High School) has recently been appointed and the project is now ready to announce the catchment area for the new school. You can view the catchment here. If you have a child in Year 6 in 2019, he/she may be eligible to enrol into the Inner Sydney High School for Year 7 in 2020. A student is able to enrol into the Inner Sydney High School as an inarea student if their permanent and principal place of residence is located in the school's designated catchment area. Enrolments will be undertaken in accordance with the NSW Department of Education's guidelines and

Primary schools will receive enrolment information for Year 6 students in March 2019 as part of the normal high school enrolment process.

Project overview

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$847 million is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

An exciting project is underway to construct the new Inner Sydney High School on the corner of Cleveland Street and Chalmers Street in Surry Hills. This new school will be a comprehensive high school focused on new and innovative ways of teaching and learning with an emphasis on technology, mobility and flexibility.

Enrolments for Term 1, 2020 will start as a staged approach to school operations with Year 7 students. Once all buildings are completed, the school will support up to 1,200 students across Years 7 – 12 over 14 storeys. This will include:

- 47 permanent adaptable learning spaces
- Multiple sporting and recreational spaces and shared use of Prince Alfred Park
- 5 'STEAM' focused floors including music, food technology and visual arts facilities

GO WITH THE FLOW (GWTF) RULES

NO DOUBLE PARKING on either side of the slip road – offenders will be photographed. Police and rangers are patrolling the area both morning and afternoon.

NO PARENTS SHOULD BE GETTING OUT OF THEIR CAR in the GWTF line as this causes unnecessary delays. Please be courteous, considerate and use common sense when dropping off or picking up kids in GWTF.

SHOW APPRECIATION TO ALL OUR HELPERS with a simple smile and thank you, while they are assisting your children.

GIVE CARS ON THE RIGHT AND BEHIND YOU, RIGHT OF WAY when pulling off from the GWTF line.

BUSES HAVE RIGHT OF WAY before attempting to use the turning circle

PLEASE DO NOT SLIP INTO THE GWTF LINE UNLESS YOU SEE A LARGE ENOUGH SPACE to Park parallel with the pavement. (Many cars park at an angle which creates further congestion). PLEASE PASS ON THIS INFORMATION to anyone picking up your children
