

### **PEER MEDIATION @ BHPS**

From Term 2 BHPS will be using Peer Mediators to help resolve minor conflicts with students. Peer mediation programs are used in schools to teach students the principles and techniques of conflict resolution so that they can solve their own minor disputes. Year 6 students have been trained under the supervision of Ms Vlahos to use a systematic mediation process to resolve disputes. Peer Mediation fits into the Department's Student Welfare, Anti-bullying, Anti-racism and Antidiscrimination policies and procedures. Peer Mediation invites students (disputants) to take responsibility for their actions by working together to find solutions to conflict. It involves two trained students (mediators) leading the disputants through a structured process. The mediators do not take sides and conflicts mediated remain confidential. Ms Vlahos will provide ongoing supervision and support for Year 6 BHPS student mediators.

The program aims to:

- increase awareness of how conflict affects people's lives
- improve communication between students and between teachers and students
- empower students by having them take greater responsibility for resolving their own disputes


























This year in library class, BHPS students are being encouraged to participate in the 2019 NSW Premiers Reading Challenge. The challenge began on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March and concludes on Friday 30<sup>st</sup> August. All books must be logged online by 11.59pm on this date for your child to receive a certificate at the end of the year. You may need to assist your child to log their books online, however extensive demonstrations have been given in Library lessons and additional assistance will be available in future lessons and at Library Lunchtime should your child need. All books must be logged online. The following instructions should assist you to do this at home. Don't hesitate to contact me should you have any further questions. Happy Reading!

The PRC website is on the DET Portal. Students need to log into their DET PORTAL here, using their personal username and password; <u>https://student.det.nsw.edu.au/</u>

#### To access the Premiers Reading Challenge Website;

- Go to the LEARNING link and click on More.
- Click on the Premiers Reading Challenge link.
- If you are not logged on, click Log On and use the same log in details as you do for your portal.

To access the new PRC website, follow the link on the homepage. If the 2019 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge heading is on a green background, you are already on the new website. Click the red arrow to watch a video on how to use the new website.

- To view your child's Student Reading Record, click on the Avatar in the top right hand corner of the screen and then on My Reading Record to the left of the page.
- Click Saved Books next to the Student Reading Records link, to view books you have saved.
- To return to the home screen, click Home in the top right hand corner.

#### To log books;

- Type the name of your book in the Blue Box and click Search. Scroll down to find your book and click Add to Student Reading Record.
- Alternatively, click on the appropriate year group and genre icons in the Yellow Box to guide your search, as
  described in the video. Once again, scroll down to find your book and click Add to Student Reading Record.

#### Basic rules of the Challenge;

- K-2 students can log books from the K-2 lists, as well as the Year 3-4 lists if they want a greater challenge.
- Year 3/4 students can log books from the Year 3-4 lists, as well as the Year 5-6 lists
- Year 5/6 students can log books from the Year 5/6 lists, as well as the Year 7-9 lists (with parent consent)
- The rules indicate that Year 3-6 students must read the books themselves but K-2 students may have help.
- To receive a certificate, K-2 students must read and log 30 books.
- To receive a certificate, Year 3-6 students must read and log 20 books.
- 5 of the 20 or 30 logged books <u>can be</u> books of the student's own choice. This is optional. <u>Pink icons will</u> appear on the Student Reading Record for such books. The system will not let you log more than 5.
- Own choice books can be read in the student's first language, if English is their second language.
