Gifted and Talented (G&T) programs

The Dept of Education has released a new *High Potential and Gifted Education Policy* which explores different aspects of Gifted Education. The release of this document is timely for Bellevue Hill teachers and students as it fits neatly into, and enhances, our efforts to revise our gifted programs at BHPS this year.

Enrichment, extension and extracurricular programs are common features of many gifted education programs across Australia. *Extension programs* seek to increase the depth and challenge of learning within the same year group or classroom, while *enrichment programs* seek to broaden the learning experiences across different contexts with like-minded students grouped together to work on challenging learning problems. *Extracurricular programs* seek to extend students in a particular area of interest or talent that lie outside the more traditional experiences in the classroom such as debating, student leadership, dance, sport, music and technology.


