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#### **Principal's Report**

#### **Parent and Carer Behaviour Expectations**

Our school is committed to building a safe and happy environment for students, staff, parents and the broader community.

We encourage parents and carers to advocate strongly on their child's behalf and, as part of this, expect them to raise concerns about their child. Sometimes these concerns may relate to the way a child may have been treated by another student at this school.

It is natural for parents and carers to feel protective of their children. However you must <u>not</u> raise any concerns you have about the behaviour of another child directly with that child (or his or her parents while they are at school) but should instead report your concerns to the principal or a member of the executive team.

Your concerns will be taken seriously and responded to promptly.

If a parent, carer or other community member raises their concerns directly with a child (or their parents while they are at school) this may result in the access that person has to the school site being restricted or withdrawn. We greatly value the contribution parents, carers and other community members make to the school community and do not wish to take any action that impacts on their participation in school activities.

Please let us know if you have concerns about the behaviour of another person's child while they are at school or on school related activities. Raising your concerns directly with the child (or his or her parents while they are at school) could result in your access to the school site being restricted or withdrawn.

# **Step into STEM @ BHPS**

#### **STEM Immersion Day in Kindergarten**

On Monday 16 September, Kindergarten students engaged in learning all about STEM. After completing our conceptual unit about energy and movement, Kindergarten used their knowledge to create a balloon powered car. First we experimented with the force of air. Students researched through watching videos and observing balloons moving through the air in real life. We then predicted how we could use this force to move a model car. Students went on to design and create balloon powered cars which we then tested in the form of a race.

All students recorded their predictions and observations and reflected on the experiment. Kindergarten students enjoyed being scientists for the day and are now ready to take on more STEM challenges!
















## Music at @ BHPS

# Sydney Spring Cycle 2019 TEAM BHPS 13 October 2019

For the 4<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year, Bellevue Hill Public School is entering a team in the **10km City Ride** as part of the **Bicycle NSW Spring Cycle** on **Sunday, 13 October 2019.** To date, BHPS students and their families have raised close to \$10,000 for the Sydney Children's Hospital Foundation as part of their participation in this event. This event is open to all students who are accompanied by an adult. Children must ride on a parent's bicycle if they are under 8 years of age on race day. All other students may ride independently on their own bicycle.

This event complements our 'You Can Do It' program, as involvement promotes: Positive Attitudes 'I Can Do It', 'Giving Effort', 'Time Management', 'Setting Goals' and 'Planning My Time' in our students. It's also a great way to encourage health and wellbeing as well as community spirit. The emphasis on the day is on participation. The Spring Cycle is an annual event, presented by Bicycle NSW. It is the largest community bike ride in the state, with over 10,000 riders participating. It gives people of all ages and abilities, on bikes of all shapes and sizes, the opportunity to see one of the most beautiful cities in the world from the saddle. The 10km Sydney City Ride is ideal for families and novice riders who want to experience the thrill of riding over the Sydney Harbour Bridge main deck and past some of Sydney's most iconic landmarks including the Sydney Opera House and historic Rocks area. Celebrate your Spring Cycle success with a cold drink, food and all the excitement that is happening at the finish site in Pirrama Park, Pyrmont.
