Maths: Problem Solving in Year 5





Jonah F. – "At first, I was uncomfortable but then it got easier and easier so I got used to it more."




Creative Arts @ BHPS

Success in the International Math Olympiad

Thirty students who learn Russian at our school took part in the international competition in mathematics. This competition was organised by the Russian education authorities. It was offered to everyone who learns Russian outside the Russian Federation. There were six million students from 70 different countries who participated. All questions were in Russian!

Ronen (Year 5) received the Honorary Award scoring amazing 75 points out of 100. This result placed him in the top 20% of students around the World.

The Tell Them From Me parent survey

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.
