Remote learning for Term 2

It has just been announced by the NSW Government that this new world of learning will continue for term 2. It is important that sustainability is built around these programs. We are here to support parents and students throughout this new learning environment. Here are a few things to remember with online learning:

- Goggle Classroom and Class Dojo are for student learning only
- Parents need to email the teacher if they have any questions, concerns, suggestions, or complaints.
- Literacy and numeracy is the priority for all students

Connecting students to teachers Live Video trial

The Department is trialling Zoom. This does not have the recording tools of the public Zoom application

At Bellevue Hill Public School we will trial this next week as a communication tool between teachers and students. Lessons are currently being filmed and uploaded for students to access at anytime.

Teachers will only use this in the scheduled time and there will be two teachers online at once. Our initial trials at school have found that if you have an iPad you will need to access the **Zoom Cloud Meetings App.**

Teachers will post on Google Classroom, Class Dojo or email student, parents and carers the information they need to access this.

Students', parents & carers expectations include:

- Students logged into the student portal prior to access the link
- Students not to share the link with any other student
- Students need to be mindful that everyone can see that them and dress accordingly
- Students need to ensure things such as the tv/music is not on that will interrupt learning
- Parents and siblings need to be mindful that students are online with their peers






Writing- students were asked to cook a meal at home or create a board game. They then used this experience to write a procedure for the recipe or instructions on how to play the game.



Mathematics- students have been learning about the properties of 3D objects and have created their own models.


















In maths this week, Year 3 have been learning about fractions.


It has been wonderful having students share their learning from home in a variety of ways. We would like to congratulation the students who have really embraced using Google Classroom!

Sunday, 26 December 2004, 4:00pm

Dear diary, I couldn't wait to write in you. I have a story to tell you. This morning for breakfast, Aulia and I decided to have some Cendol and pisang goreng out on the balcony. That is a very special treat, and it was extra unhealthy because Aulia had brought some Black Klepon to have for breakfast too. We were having so much fun out on the balcony eating. Then, a deafening sound came from the beach below. It sounded like water crashing. It sounded like destruction. It sounded like branches breaking and houses crumbling. It sounded like a stampede of growling lions. I could hear screams. It sounded horrible!

The whole ocean had risen up, higher than the buildings lining the beach. Giant waves came crashing over the town, as if it were munching away on the town homes. Water was destroying houses, trees and cars. Buses were swept away and boats were tumbling around what used to be the town streets - I never knew that water could be so destructive... until now. I tried to look away but my eyes kept drawing me back to the horrific view. The water was racing over the land, like a cat chasing a mice. The Year 5 students have been taking on their learning tasks with enthusiasm and the teachers are extremely proud of the students who have been logging in each day and submitting their tasks.

The Year 5 students are used to using Google Classroom as we use this day to day throughout the year, however, we have seen a new level of maturity from our students as they problem solve through the unknown aspects of the online platform.

Some of the fantastic learning tasks our students are engaged in include making videos of themselves as teachers, explaining maths concepts to their pretend students; typing their narrative writing and using rubrics to self-assess; and art lessons, focusing on warm and cool colours.





Student Wellbeing

Russian Language Students

Year 4-6 students displayed outstanding character and strength when working on creating bilingual books for learning Russian and English. They showed outstanding resilience and persistence.

At the start of Term 1, students in Year 6 successfully completed translations and editing of a number of books from English to Russian. This outstanding outcome not only shows a high level of proficiency in the Russian language but also points out resilience in focusing on the translating pages and pages of the picture books. The editing process was quite daunting as students needed to check and correct all typo, grammar and punctuation mistakes. In Weeks 5-7, students from Year 4 Daniela, Lola and Ariana often sacrificed their recess and lunch play times for cutting out the translated lines and attaching them into the books. There were still a lot of books to finish when the health alert came it made it even harder to complete the task.

While the transition time from learning at school to learning at home that was happening in Weeks 8-10, Ariana (Year 4), Luka (Year 5) and Anna O (Year 6) were finishing off attaching the translated lines into the actual books.

This collaborative work accumulated and enriched our school resources with bilingual books. The books aim to help younger students to expand their vocabulary,

raise their confidence and develop greater interest in reading.

"It appeared a very fun job after all," said the students.

"We were very persistent and did not give up even if it was hard."

"We were positive and stayed happy even at times when we were tired."

"We were resilient because when it did not work we tried to read again and again both English and Russian so the translated lines matched the original texts."

"We were getting along because we were helping each other."

I am happy to let the school community know about the great success of our students in the Russian competition "Russian Bear - Linguistics for Everybody" in 2019!

Years 3 to 6 students who learn Russian at our school took part in the world-wide competition in the Russian language. This competition was offered to everyone who learns Russian around the World. There were around six million participating students from 70 different countries. All questions and answers were in Russian!

Ariana T (Year 4) received the Diploma of Excellence scoring amazing 71 points out of 100. This result placed her in the top 20% of students around the World. Sofya B and Ronen B from Year 6 and Alissa D from year 4 received their Certificates of Honour. Their results put them in the top 50% of students who took part in this completion around the World.

More to the excitement was a participation of six PARENTS and GRANDPARENTS who did the work that was offered to Years 12+.
