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Principal's Report

Next week we are set to welcome back all of our students to Bellevue Hill PS. The teachers are pleased that they are returning which will enable them to devote their time to face-to-face teaching with students and teacher interaction happening once again. There will be no further remote teaching and learning.

Although school life will be a little different with no assemblies, excursions/incursions or camps etc in the short term, we are able to run library, languages and sports programs as normal thank goodness.

To keep adults away from your children, only essential services will be allowed on site and of course, we are asking your assistance to remain offsite as well. The most difficult time is dismissal in the afternoon, so please adhere to our guidelines for the safety of the children

On arrival

- Kiss and go children at the school gate
 This has been working successfully for all grades the last two weeks
- 8.45am 9.00am: students are supervised on school grounds
- 9.00am the bell rings and they move to their class
- 9.15am school begins and the roll is marked
- Children who arrive after this time need to go to the front office to receive a late note

On Dismissal

Parents can come onto school grounds to collect their children or wait outside the school fence. At all times we ask parents and caregivers to please stay **close to the outside fence.**

If you are inside the school;

- Kindy, Year 1 & 2 (and siblings) parents on fence line near the hall.
- Years 3-6 parents on fence line in front of the school building.

At all times we ask parents and caregivers to please stay close to the outside fence.

Children will come to you – you do not need to go to the children

- **2.45pm: Kindergarten** and siblings dismissed from the COLA steps (outside the hall)
- 3.00pm: Year 1 & Year 2 and siblings dismissed from the COLA steps (outside the hall)
- **3.15pm: Year 3 Year 6** dismissed from the front of the building

Go With The Flow (GWTF) will begin to operate from 3.00pm.

- 3.00pm: Kindy, Year 1 and Year 2 and siblings
 3.15pm: Years 3 6
- We ask parents/carers of older children (who do not have younger siblings) to **NOT** arrive prior to 3.15pm as this will cause a traffic jam.
- · Please **DO NOT** get out of your car at any time.
- Please confirm with your children that you are picking them up at GWTF that morning.

Bubblers

We have been directed by the Department of Education to stop the use of bubblers. Please ensure that your child has a water bottle that can be refilled throughout the day. Many thanks for your cooperation with this.

Riley and her parents moved to Melbourne last year straight after she completed Year 3.


This year, the lock down enabled her to continue learning piano with Dr Petrova via Skype or WhatsApp.
