Principal's Report

All schools have now returned to full-time on-campus learning. With updated health advice and changes to state and national restrictions, we have received advice that schools are able to recommence the majority of school-based activities from either 15 June 2020 or the start of Term 3 (20 July 2020).

Activities/site usage that can already take place:

- Use the school library
- Engage in non-contact sporting activities
- Canteens and uniform shops can open at principal's discretion

Activities/site usage that can take place from Monday 15 June 2020

- School assemblies (limited to 15 minutes and no external visitors)
- Choirs and performing arts at school, with safety protocols in place
- Students may attend other schools for essential curriculum related reasons or placements (e.g. auditions or placement tests)
- Incursions/external providers can provide activities that support delivery of curriculum (e.g. music tutors, sport skills development programs, science demonstrations, drama tutors, Healthy Harold).
- Community use activities used by students such as dance classes, and student sport skills development, outside of school hours with limited adult attendance)
- Day field trips to outdoor locations with no physical distancing requirements can take place
- School photos



Activities/site usage that can take place from beginning of Term 3

- All sport on school grounds and activities including competitions aligned with current health advice (including those activities run by external organisations)
- •Inter-school student events and competitions (choirs, debating, public speaking, etc) performing arts
- SRE/SEE (Scripture & Ethics) lessons
- Work experience for students
- P&C meetings with a strong preference for on-line
- Parent/teacher meetings where these need to take place strong preference for online where possible unless involving serious matters that require face to face discussion
- Community use activities involving general adult attendance (such as community markets)

Activities on hold from Term 3

The following events will be reconsidered in Term 3.

- School camps
- Excursions (other than field trips explained above)
- Parent attendance at assemblies and other school events (e.g. graduation ceremonies or speech events)
- Parent volunteers e.g. parent reading helpers (canteen and uniform shop volunteers are permitted)
- School based activities that involve large gatherings of adults are not permitted at this time. These include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events.

These large gatherings will continue to be reviewed and assessed based on AHPPC and NSW Health advice and may be permitted at a later date.



The student's have learnt so many interesting facts about honey bees.


Chloe: "Honey bees can flap their wings 200 times every second".

Max S: "Honey bees have 270 degree vision".


Brianna: "The worker honey bees communicate where particular plants/flowers are through a special dance".


All In This Together



We linked this learning to ourselves and how it is important to celebrate everyone's cultural identity and differences.








Garden update!

Could you be an ethics coordinator for our school?

Our current ethics coordinator is moving on at the end of this year and we are seeking a volunteer so that classes can continue next year.

Ethics classes are currently available at BHPS from kindergarten to year 6.

The ethics coordinator communicates with school staff, supports ethics teachers and liaises with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the program.

This role provides a great opportunity for a working parent who might be unable to volunteer during school hours and is a rewarding way to engage with the school community. Times are flexible, requiring approximately 1-2 hours per week. Online training is provided.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way? fairness

Student Absences

Is your child absent from school today?

If your child is going to be absent for 5 or more days an application of extended leave form is required to be given to the office, along with a copy of any e-ticket if applicable for approval by the Principal.

Arriving Late to school

Students are to enter through the main gate next to the bus stop. Press the button and an office person will answer. The door will be automatically unlocked. They will need to push the gate open. We ask that you may need to help your child enter through the next pool gate and then instruct them to go directly to the office for a late arrival slip that is taken with them to the class teacher.

During this Covid-19 period, we ask that all parents, carers etc do not enter the school site.

Leaving Early

If you are collecting a child early for appointments etc advanced notice to the class teacher is appreciated, however, we understand that this is not always possible. Your child will be sent down to meet you at the gate.
