Promoting CREATIVITY, INNOVATION, **CRITICAL THINKING & COLLABORATION in KINDY**

At BHPS, the kindergarten teachers run 4 weekly literacy group sessions to provide multiple opportunities for targeted practice of new and old skills. The sessions promote independence and collaboration but also open the door to more tailored hands-on activities, to suit the needs of all learners in our classroom.

During literacy groups, students rotate through a series of stations which focus on different skills.

Below are just a few examples of our literacy group stations.

Using technology in Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have been using the iPads and laptops to help us with our learning.

Throughout this term, during our writing lessons, we have been focusing on how to write an imaginative and descriptive narrative. The Year 2 students have shown creativity and enthusiasm when writing stories of their own. Students then used the laptops and iPads to publish their narratives.

We learnt how to log in to the Student Portal, find the Google Docs program and start a new document of our own. We also got to improve our typing skills!

Stories of Migration in Year 4

Throughout Term 3 Year 4 students studied 'Waves of Migration' in Australian History. Students inquired into the patterns of migration in our past and how it has shaped Australia's identity.





They investigated a vast range of people from different histories and cultural backgrounds who moved from foreign shores and now call Australia home.

Finally, students interviewed family and friends about personal and remarkable immigration journeys. They discovered amazing stories that have shaped our country's identity and provided our Year 4 students with an understanding of their own identities.
