
School Spectacular

The students then worked in small groups to discuss and explore the properties of 3D objects.








Promoting CREATIVITY, INNOVATION, CRITICAL THINKING & COLLABORATION in Year 3

This term Year 3 has been learning about physical and chemical reactions. We have been investigating the difference between the two, asking questions, creating hypotheses, creating step-by-step procedures and making scientific observations. This week we are combining these lessons to build our very own spaceship! Yes you read that correctly. Students could choose to power their spaceship with either a physical reaction (air pressure) or a chemical reaction (lemon juice and bicarb soda). Thank you to all the parents who supplied us with old plastic bottles to build our rockets.

YEAR 5 - MATHEMATICS


'Mental Computation Strategies'

Year 5 have been revising the many **strategies** that can be used to assist **'mental computation'** in Maths. The intention of developing this skill is to be able to calculate the answer quickly and accurately, without the need to use pen and paper and an algorithm. It is often the faster method of finding an answer.



In **Addition** and **Subtraction** we have been refreshing our knowledge of the following strategies: Friendly Chunks, Friendly Balance, Friendly and Fix, Friendly Pairs and Place Value.


In *Multiplication* we have been revising: Fives and Fifties, Split and Multiply, Friendly Factors, Friendly and Fix and Place Value.





In **Division** we have been revising the mental strategies of: Fractions as Division, Split and Divide, Friendly and Fix and Place Value.
